

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER REFERRAL

Red Flags:

Patient shows signs or reports:

- Depression/anxiety
- uncontrolled high blood pressure,
- psychosis,
- sleep disruption,
- unexpected weight loss or gain,
- tremors,
- early refill request on prescriptions (ie: opiates, benzos, stimulants, amphetamines) or request by name

Screening Tool: CAGE AID

1. Desire to **C**ut down on drinking/drug use.
2. **A**nnoyed by criticism or questions on drinking/drug use.
3. **G**uilty about drinking/drug use?
4. **E**ye opener: do you use to steady nerves or treat hangover?

IF one or more positive responses on CAGE-AID:

First, attend to medical need/treatment. Then:

- ✓ Consider preventive Naloxone (Narcan) by prescription, free drop-in training/distribution each Friday 1PM -4 PM Skip's Pharmacy 700 Michigan Ave Holland, or 10AM-12PM at Grand Haven Community Mental Health 1111 Fulton St #1 Grand Haven, or free Narcan by mail at www.naloxoneforall.org/michigan
- ✓ Consider medication contract/controlled substances agreement
- ✓ Consider referral to Medication Assisted Treatment "MAT" (methadone, suboxone or vivitrol provider)

High Acuity	Rising Risk	Low Acuity
-Active withdrawal -History of overdose -History of MAT or need for MAT -Pregnancy	-Self-medicating with drugs - Use of several different drugs -H/O alcohol or other substance Misuse	-Physical withdrawal symptoms but not drug seeking -Typically adherent, but ran out of prescription early

Low Acuity/Rising Risk: Priority Health Medicaid (living in Ottawa County) or Commercial insurance refer to Holland Hospital Behavioral Health Services 616-355-3926, otherwise refer to an SUD entry point below.

High Acuity: For Ottawa County residents, call Ottawa CMH provider line to consult 616 393-4424 with the following:
